Special Transport Reimbursement (TG) during <u>spread-out Teaching</u> <u>experience</u> in the 1st and 2nd Year of Teacher Education

If you need help with transportation between your home and placement school in connection with the <u>5 spread-out days</u>, you may apply for transport reimbursement (TG) – provided that certain specific conditions are met.

- In the 1st year, this applies to the 5 spread-out Tuesdays in the autumn semester and the 5 spread-out Tuesdays in the spring semester.
- In the 2nd year, this applies to the 5 spread-out Tuesdays in the autumn semester.

Special conditions for receiving transport reimbursement (TG)

You must meet at least one of the following conditions:

- **Route:** It is not possible to use bus, train, or metro for the entire or part of the route between your home and the placement site (typically if there is more than 12 km from your home to the nearest public transport).
- **Waiting time:** Your total waiting time in connection with public transport is at least two hours per placement day (waiting time is defined as time between arrival and the official start of the placement and/or time after the end of the placement day).
- **Travel time:** Public transport increases your total daily travel time by more than two hours compared to traveling by car.
- § 114: You have a permanent physical or mental disability and have been approved for support for the purchase of a car under § 114 of the Danish Social Services Act.

The above must be documented when applying.

What can you receive transport reimbursement (TG) for?

- You may apply for reimbursement of travel expenses between your home and the teaching experience school on the spread-out days.
- Reimbursement is only granted for the part of the distance exceeding 24 km round trip.
- Reimbursement is not granted for the part exceeding 300 km round trip.
- ➤ That means: You can receive transport reimbursement for a maximum of 276 km per day.

Note: Youth Card and transport reimbursement (TG) cannot be combined for placement.

- You cannot receive both transport reimbursement and a Youth Card for the same route and period.
- If you have used a Youth Card for transportation to the placement, you cannot receive transport reimbursement for that route.
- However, you may still use your Youth Card for travel to your place of study.

How to apply

- The application for transport reimbursement (TG) must be submitted before the placement begins.
- You only need to apply once per placement period.
- Remember to save documentation (e.g., travel itineraries, receipts if relevant).

Do you have a residence permit from SIRI?

If you are a citizen of a country outside the Nordic region or EU/EEA, and you have a residence permit in Denmark as a student, receiving a transport discount in the form of a Youth Card or mileage reimbursement may affect your right to stay in Denmark. It may mean that you lose your basis for residence.

This applies, for example, if you are on a study stay/exchange program in Denmark.

It is your own responsibility to comply with the rules for your residence permit in Denmark, including the rule that you may not receive public financial support for living expenses.
